As we entered into July, we recalled that the first of the month was the feast of our patron, St. Junipero Serra. Interestingly, Fr. Nicolaus' flight to Mount Angel Seminary was scheduled for that day. We know that is no coincidence, but rather a blessing!

A new celebration this month falls on the Fourth Sunday It marks the first annual World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, recently instituted by Pope Francis. She also included a reference to Mother Teresa, who, when close to dying said, "I have worked for God all of my life and I know I will soon be dancing in heaven. But I wish I had danced more during my time on earth." All my friends know that I am a dancer. I am definitely dancing now, having recently gone back to country/line dancing. So, for all elders and/or grandparents, let's enjoy our special day commemorating us!

Priesthood in the Roman Catholic Church by the Most Reverend Kevin W. Vann, Bishop of Orange, on Saturday, June 12 at the iconic Christ Cathedral.

It was the first ordination of priests in the diocese since COVID-19 restrictions were loosened and the third held in Christ Cathedral since it was officially dedicated in July 2019.

Rev. Brandon Dang, director of vocations for the Diocese of Orange, called the three, "incredible men. . . All of them were raised in Orange County so they are very much homegrown sons of their local parishes," Rev. Dang explains. "I think that will add to the culture and relatability of the parishioners to their new priests."
