Prez Sez – Virtue of Hope

- December 3, 10, 17, 2024


These take place at the Pastoral Center at the Christ Cathedral.

On November 19th Seminarian, David Hoang, Gave the History of His Vocation

normal, active child but
at the age of 10, he had

a breakdown of the meaning of life. His dad came into his room after he heard him crying and explained that after this earth, there is heaven with God where we go after living our life. A calmness came over him after those encouraging words. After high school, he went to into the seminary. That is where his discernment occurred. He went to Bishop White Seminary (Spokane) for four (4) years and now is at Mount Angel for two (2) years.


The young go into the seminary to seek a place away from distractions. There are new stages of formation for the seminarians: Vocational Synthesis (6 mo - ! yr.), Configuration (3.5 yrs.), Discipline (2-4 yrs.) and Propaedeutic (1-3 yrs.). David is doing part of his Vocational Synthesis at the Immaculate Heart of Mary in a rough part of Santa Ana with very faith filled parishioners. Prayers have great effect on the

seminarians and he thanks the Serrans for all their prayers.

On December 3rd Matt Ivary Spoke on Our Lake of Guadalupe

In 1519 - 1521 the MesoAmerican world had been turned upside down. The Aztec empire had been destroyed. Ruling elites stayed in power aligning with Cortez. The Native Americans were dying in great numbers from serial pandemics of new foreign diseases.

A young man named Juan Diego, walked the area during this time. The Blessed Mary appeared to Juan Diego on the road as a 14-15-year old indigenous woman. The first time she wanted him to visit the bishop and tell him about Mary appearing and wanting the bishop to build a Shrine at Talabush to help the people. Juan Diego did as she asked. The bishop wanted proof that Our Lady had appeared to him.



He went back to tell her that he needed proof. Our Lady told him to go up the hill and gather flowers, Castillian roses, unheard of in Mexico in the winter. When the

bishop saw these roses presented to him, he also saw on Juan Diego's tilma the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

She was standing on the moon with a crown with stars on it. She was blocking out the sun that was blazing behind her. This showed that she was all






powerful over the moon and the sun. Our Lady's clothing was made up of different colors. The stars on the cloak is exactly the constellations in the sky in the exact position that they would be at an eclipse as the moon depicts.

When the tilma was presented to the bishop, all present witnessed the miracle. She appeared to Juan Diego 4 times and once to his uncle, who was sick and healed by Our Lady. The tilma still exists under glass in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. The image converted 10 million people in the Americas. Faith and hope were given to the people by God.

Brothers & Sisters in Christ:

Mostly recently, I had the opportunity to participate in a good friend's 64th birthday celebration. It was a complete "surprise" to him. As we gathered together to offer our

words of congratulation on reaching this milestone, I could not help but reflect on how he turned his life completely around with the help of a little sacramental grace and the influence of a parish priest.

My dear friend had been battling with a chronic case of alcoholism. It had invaded every aspect of his life – his martial relationship, his relationship with his children, his work, as well as his encounters with close friends. He had entered into a very dark place without any way out. Well, no human way out for his good friend, Jesus, would not let him go any farther hurting the ones he loved and who loved him dearly.

It was a hot Saturday in July when my friend realized that he needed help. Turning to the one place that he always found solace and comfort, he decided to take the advice of his family and go to confession. On that particular summer day, he entered the confessional a broken man and was immediately greeted by his parish priest. Seeing a sullen look upon his face, he had him sit and begin his confession. This confession was like no other for my friend. He realized that it was time to come clean and let it all out -the addiction, the depression, the confusion, the shame and disappointment. He recounted how he truly felt the love of Jesus radiate through his parish priest. His eyes reflected the heart of Jesus. He listened but didn't judge. He spoke with compassion rather than condemnation. His gaze was only one of a true friend who would not abandon him in his hour of need. Needless to say, he received his penance and put it to good work. Rather than become a fatal statistic, he turned his life around and became a man grateful that Jesus, through his earthy persona (aka priest), rescued him before it became too late.

Watching him celebrate his birthday reminded me how life is a grand celebration, especially when we receive the sanctifying grace to live it well which is provided by Jesus' earthly persona – his priests. What a gift it can be when we receive those gifts often. What joy can come when we appreciate who suffered, died and rose to make it all happen for each of us. What a blessing it is to have such an opportunity available literally 24-7. It is always just a car ride, casual stroll or even a bike ride away.

As we move into the new year, let us raise our glasses to Christ for creating the ministerial priesthood. Let us toast Him well for continuing to bless us with holy men dedicated to following his example of obedience, humility and loving service. Let us pop open a bottle and dedicate it to





Him for allowing us to pray earnestly for vocations and always acting upon those prayers with urgency and zeal.

Wishing you happy holidays and joy in Christ Jesus always, time knowing full well what will come – only goodness and kindness all the days of your life.
