


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

SPEAKER



The Serra Club of Orange County was delighted to welcome February's guest speaker, Fr. Michael Fitzpatrick, Parochial Vicar at St. John Neumann in Irvine. Recently ordained in 2021 at Christ Cathedral, Fr. Fitzpatrick tells us a moving story of love, loyalty, faith and gratitude which formed the basis of his vocation to the priesthood.

Fr. Fitzpatrick's story begins with his parents, Michael and Cathy, who were high school sweethearts living in Pennsylvania. They married soon after graduating college, but two years into the marriage his father was diagnosed with Stage 3 Hodgkin's Lymphoma at the age of 23. His father

underwent 18 months of chemotherapy and Cathy never left his side, even having to sleep at the hospital. Fr. Fitzpatrick's parents emphasized to him that faith was what gave them strength.

Although his father recovered, he was left infertile. One day while driving from work, Cathy heard on the news that a mother had murdered her newborn. In total dismay, Cathy began to cry and pray to God as to how this could happen. She heard God answer, "there are other children in this world." It was the early 90's when they decided to adopt a child from Korea, and six months later they adopted their son, Michael, and five and one-half years later they adopted a girl, his sister, who is also from Korea. Fr. Fitzpatrick has observed that adoption gets a negative connotation, however it is not a lesser kind of love. In fact, that is what God does with us, a Divine Adoption. It is a conscious decision. His parents viewed them as a gift, through a perspective of thankfulness.

His parents also taught them the importance of having faith, knowing that their rebellious son would encounter tough trials, and it is something that has always stayed with him. Growing up, his family was always close, even though they would frequently move. First New Jersey, then Ohio to California, Georgia and finally California for good. Although they were frequently moving, they ALWAYS had dinner together. However, dinner conversations were dominated by Mom and Sis, the family extroverts as Father and his Dad are the introverts. Father and his sister are very close, being raised with a strong family life, attending Catholic schools and participating in Catholic programs.

It was at Servite that he first heard the call to vocation. At 15 his parents said, "you should ask God what to do with your life" and so he did, and God responded, "I want you to become a priest." He did not want to hear that! He wanted a wife and a career. Much like Father's favorite book in the Bible, the story of Jonah, Father ran from that call and enrolled at Cal State Fullerton to study to be a teacher. However, nearly ready to finish his undergraduate work, he realized that he was not excited about becoming a teacher. Without consulting his parents, he switched majors to become a Sports Writer. His parents were not happy and he

soon discoverd that he disliked Sports Journalism more than Teaching. Feeling lost (like Jonah being swallowed by the whale), and anxious, he turned to God and listened, surrendering to that call and finally feeling at peace. He admits God wanted him to see that this would be the happiest role for him.

As a newly ordained priest and this being his first talk to our Serra Club, Fr. Fitzpatrick was gifted a beautiful stole with the Serran insignia. He was very appreciative and noted that every time he wears the stole he will remember and pray for the Serrans.
