


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The beautiful month of May, Our Lady's month, brought us a wonderful guest speaker, Francis Ng, former Detention Ministry Chaplain and presently the Parochial Vicar at St. Timothy's in Laguna Niguel.

Fr. Francis was born in Hong Kong and educated by the Salesians whose philosophy was to teach students to be joyful, intelligent and obedient, an idea he greatly admired. He was taught through the Baltimore Catechism and remembers he had to pass an exam containing 320 questions in order to be baptized. From an early age young Francis knew he wanted to become a priest and therefore asked his mother for her permission. According to Chinese culture, his mother responded by telling him to first ask his grandfather, as Francis belonged to a family and not just his parents. The grandfather's response was to send an 18 year-old Francis to Venezuela to live with an uncle while his 2 brothers were sent to the U.S. and 2 of his sisters were sent to France.

In Venezuela, Francis worked in a restaurant where he learned Spanish and met the Daughters of Charity, a worldwide congregation, whose order inspired the T.V. show "The Flying Nun." The sisters were all Philippinas and they led Francis to their male counterpart, St. Vincent de Paul, where he attended Seminary to take a Philosophy course.

Upon learning that Francis would enter the Seminary, his uncle locked the door behind him asking him to never return as he exclaimed, "The priesthood is not productive!" His uncle wanted him to leave the seminary and as it all became too problematic, Francis left the seminary.

After having lived 7 years in Venezuela, Francis arrived in the U.S. to join his brothers and sisters. His desire to become a priest never left his mind and in the year 2000 he joined St. Andrew's Abbey in Vallejo, California via the internet and he studied for 5 years in Camarillo. As there were very few monks left and no community, he left the monastery and was ordained a diocesan priest. His hobbies include cooking and he enjoys working at rescue missions, as getting in touch with people is very important to him.

Fr. Francis asks us to focus on the power of prayer. "Pray, pray, pray!" he exclaims. "Otherwise, it is like we are charging our phones and not using them."
